**STAGING and PREPARATION:****Exhibitors:**

The hall doors open at 5.30 am on Saturday 11th November. Exhibitors can bring roses to the hall on  
 Friday 10th from 2.00 pm – 4.00 pm for preparation only, no staging until after 7.00 am Saturday.

**Exhibitors must collect their Entry Cards, and Rose Variety Name Cards from the front door table  
 on Saturday morning.**

**A warning bell** will sound at 9.30 am and all entries must be staged by 9.45 am Saturday.

**Judges and Stewards to assemble in the Show Hall by 10.00 am.**

**Judging will commence at 10.15 am sharp.**

**During Staging:**

1. Exhibitors must place their entry card (which is to be placed face down), beside each exhibit, as the exhibit is placed onto the Show Bench.
2. Exhibitors must also place a 'variety' card with each exhibit - with the name of the rose(s) (Use 'Name Unknown' if necessary).
3. Exhibitors are asked to make any surplus blooms available (named) for non-competitive displays, or for sale – Please take them to the kitchen area.
4. All exhibitors are requested to be present from 4.30 pm on Sunday 12th November (or arrange for someone else) to remove exhibits and help dismantle the show.

Exhibitors are requested to preferably use environmentally friendly floral foam in vases.

**It is the responsibility of all exhibitors to collect their own equipment and cards.**

**No responsibility can be taken for exhibits, cards or trophies not collected.**

**Legend of Terms and Abbreviations** used in this Show and Schedule:

<b>Stem</b>	= A stem is the stalk (original new growth) of a plant that bears (terminates with) one bud or flower. (Terminal Inflorescence)
<b>Cut</b>	= A stalk (original new growth) that carries more than one bloom and/or bud or buds. (Terminal Inflorescence)
<b>S/C</b>	= Stems and/or Cuts
<b>HT</b>	= Hybrid Tea
<b>FI</b>	= Floribunda
<b>MT</b>	= Miniature Type Roses (incl. MT seedlings)
<b>ANS</b>	= Any Number of Stems
<b>DV</b>	= Different (distinct) Varieties or Cultivars
<b>NND</b>	= Not Necessarily Different (varieties)
<b>SS</b>	= Staged Separately (in separate containers)
<b>NAS</b>	= Not According to Schedule (= Disqualification)
<b>MSE</b>	= Multi Stage Exhibit
<b>AB</b>	= Australian Bred

## **Notes, Definitions, Rules, and Regulations**

(Please refer to the 2013 NRSA Judging Handbook)

- 1 There are three classes of exhibitors: **Open**, **Intermediate**, and **Novice**.  
**Intermediate** and **Novice Classes** – An exhibitor in that Class must not have won more than 10 first prizes at RSV Shows or have been exhibiting in that class for more than three years.
- 2 Stems in all exhibits must touch water or water-retaining material.
- 3 **A Bowl** - is a container of which the height is less than the diameter (width).
  - The stem, pedestal or stand is not included in the height.
  - Is to be viewed from front. (max. diameter of the exhibit is to be no more than 300mm)
- 4 **Bunches**: Unless otherwise stated in the schedule, a Bunch shall consist of five or six stems. Stems will be counted at the level of the top of the container.
- 5 All exhibits must be staged in containers provided by the Society, unless otherwise stated.
- 6 All blooms exhibited must be grown by the exhibitor, and must be from plants **which have been grown by and have been the exclusive property of the exhibitor** for at least three months before the date of the Show.
- 7 **"Sports"** of any type of roses do not qualify as Australian Bred roses.
- 8 **More than one member** of any household may exhibit from the same garden or nursery, provided they exhibit at the classification of the highest classified member of that household.

### **JUDGING** Judges must possess NRSA Judging Handbook - revised 2013.

- 9 **POINTING** - as per the National Rose Society of Australia Judging Handbook.  
 Judging criteria for:  
**"Fragrant Roses"** – Fragrance 5 pts; Condition 2 pts; Overall Beauty and Presentation 3 pts.  
**"Basket of Roses"** – Condition is worth 4 points; Overall Beauty including evenness of size or graduation of blooms 3 points; Stem and Foliage 2 points; Presentation 1 point.  
**Pellets ("Staging preparation Aids")** – Delete 1 point for 1 pellet left in any entry and 2 points for 2 pellets. Entries with 3 or more pellets are disqualified.  
 (A Best Bunch or Best Bloom shall not be selected from an exhibit which has been disqualified.)
- 10 **Naming of your Rose Varieties** – Exhibits will be penalised one point for each variety unnamed. All exhibits should be named but misnaming will not disqualify. Where the name of the rose is not known or unnamed, the entry card is to be marked "unknown" or "unnamed"  
**- with exception that all Australian Bred Roses must be named with the red variety cards provided.**  
 (seedling roses (not available commercially) – parentage to be stated)  
**Duplicates** – The showing of duplicates in DV-specified Classes - either with the same or different names, will disqualify the exhibit.
- 11 The decision of the Judge or Judges in regard to the relative merits of exhibits shall be final.
- 12 Judges can withhold awards if exhibits are not up to the expected standard.
- 13 Under exceptional circumstances, the State judging committee summoned by the Show Manager will have the power, either before or after the judges' decision has been given, to declare an exhibit disqualified, and their decision shall be final.  
**Any protest must be declared to the Show Manager** no later than 2.30 pm on Sat 9<sup>th</sup> Nov., and the decision of the Judging Committee will be final and binding on all parties.
- 14 **The Best Two Entries in any** Championship Classes must be pointed in decimals, except where there is only one entry.
- 15 Pointing may be used to separate entries of similar merit for ALL schedule classes.
- 16 No person except the Show Manager, Judges and Stewards are permitted entry into the show area during judging.
- 17 It is expected that all exhibitors will comply with the Society Rules where applicable.
